Jaak Kilmi's film "DISCO AND ATOMIC WAR" is to explain why all the older people in northern coast of Estonia speak Finnish. And, building on the disco, KRISTI GRIŠAKOV, social scientist from Aalto University, reveals the great future of the twin-city Talsinki/Hellinn. Possible guest MARTEN KAEVATS (architect) sheds light to the third industrial revolution soon to come. All the futures are followed by quite pleasant present - a late dinner with a view to the sea and another smooth discussion.
